FRIENDS OF CORONADO STATE HISTORIC SITE 2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The Friends of Coronado State Historic Site (FCHS) is a dynamic and fun organization dedicated to providing financial support, volunteers, and advocacy for the Coronado and Jemez State Historic Sites.

CORONAVIRUS REBOUND

Despite continued challenges from COVID-19, New Mexico State Historic Sites reopened on a limited basis in February 2021, and the Friends of Coronado began a slow march towards more normal operations. Volunteers eagerly returned to operate the Gift Shop, conduct visitor tours, and catch up on landscape maintenance and garden tasks. Gift Shop sales rebounded strongly, although full-year results lagged behind 2020. Behind the scenes, much-needed administrative tasks were accomplished, and our organization actively supported archaeological research in New Mexico. The FCHS Board of Directors is especially proud of the volunteers who kept our members engaged through a high quality virtual lecture series, a number of COVID-safe outdoor activities, and a special camping experience at Chaco Canyon. FCHS looks forward to resuming the annual Fiesta of Cultures in 2022.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS

- **Volunteerism**: Donated more than 2,160 volunteer hours in 2021, valued at more than \$61,640.
- Fundraising: Raised over \$43,120 (before expenses) for Coronado (CHS) and Jemez (JHS) Historic Sites; funding came from Sun Father's Gift Shop, member dues, donations, and the Chaco trip.
- Gift Shop: Sold \$27,192 of merchandise, netting over \$15,815 in profit.
- Total financial support provided: Invested over \$11,600 to support both Historic Sites, notably the docent program \$687; the lecture series \$1,350; a bronze plaque recognizing John Gaw Meem as the architect of the CHS Visitor Center building \$900; laboratory analysis of objects found by the metal detector study at CHS \$1,086; supplemental funding for an original steel sculpture displayed at JHS as part of the New Mexico Art in Public Places program \$800; technical publications \$4,639; and the academic awards program \$2,915.
- Chaco Canyon camping trip: Conducted a very successful three-day camping experience at Chaco Canyon attended by 23 members, with guided walks and lectures on archaeology, astronomy, photography, and the impacts of resource extraction on a fragile landscape; raised over \$4,100.
- Communications: Increased to 33 the number of videos on the FCHS YouTube channel; significantly upgraded the kuaua.org website and created a new version optimized for viewing on mobile devices; maintained a Facebook presence; promoted FCHS programs via advertising and events calendars.
- Administration: Established a cloud-based digital archive to permanently store important documents; brought the Gift Shop credit card machine into compliance with industry standards; Significantly upgraded the kuaua.org website and created a new version optimized for mobile devices.

The Friends of Coronado Historic Site is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation. Its mission is to support the conservation and restoration of historical assets and museum exhibits and to promote, through community outreach, the historical and cultural significance of the Coronado and Jemez Historic sites, encompassing the ancestral pueblos of Kuaua (home to the renowned Painted Kiva) and Giusewa, the Coronado Expedition, and the Mission of San Jose de los Jemez.

VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION AND AWARDS

Dedicated FCHS member **Barbara Williams has received the distinguished Richard A. Bice Award -2021** for excellence in the field of archaeology from the Archaeological Society of New Mexico (ASNM). Together with her late husband Gary, Barbara joined the fledgling FCHS in the organization's early days and has long been an active volunteer. Barbara has served as Program Chair and as President of the FCHS Board, and she ably managed the Fiesta of Cultures for 10 years. Since 2007, she has also been the "unsung hero" of our informative and engaging FCHS quarterly newsletter.

As reported in 2020, the honoree of the **ASNM 2021 Annual Volume** was FCHS Board President Emeritus **James Conder**. This scholarly publication, "*A Friend of Kuaua: Papers in Honor of James Conder*," includes seventeen articles, most focusing on the latest research and interpretation of Kuaua and Giusewa Pueblos, the Coronado expedition, and the Tiguex War. It is now available for purchase from the ASNM.

NEW TECHNICAL PUBLICATION

A technical report by Regge Wiseman, et al., "Archaeology of LA 4955: A Descriptive Report of the 1970 *Excavations Next to the Coronado Historic Site, Sandoval, County, New Mexico.*" This is the never-before-published report of excavations at the hacienda site known as Casa Quemada.

ACADEMIC AWARDS PROGRAM

The FCHS Board has granted three awards totaling over \$2,900 to post graduate students conducting research in support of New Mexico archaeology:

- Javier Eli Astorga Villareal "Fortification at Spanish Colonial Presidios"
- Thatcher Rogers "Radiocarbon Dating of Materials From Chamisal Village Site"
- Jana Valesca Meyer "How Lifetime Changes to Bones of the Hand Reflect Cultural Change"

Each awardee will be asked to make a presentation to the FCHS membership at a later date.
